Have you ever wondered how animals sense the world around them? Do you know that some of the senses they possess are far superior to ours? How do migrating birds find their way? How come some animals can foresee bad weather? It is only through recent years of intensive scientific study that scientists have finally come closer than ever before to having a complete understanding of the amazing senses of animals.

Pythons, boa constrictors and anacondas can detect temperature changes as small as 0.003 deg C and respond to them in as short as 35

milliseconds. The vampire bat has a weird patch of skin on its face known as the nose-leaf, and this can detect heat so acutely that the blind bat can pinpoint an animal 16 centimetres away. Certain migratory birds can detect very small changes in air pressure, hence aiding them to predict weather and maintain height while flying.

Ever wondered why cockroaches are so difficult to nab? This could be because it has sensitive vibration detectors in its legs that can pick up movements as tiny as 2000 times the diameter of a hydrogen atom!

Scorpions have special hairs that can detect an air current moving as slowly as 0.072 kilometres per hour, and these help the scorpions to move in a straight line. The bill of the platypus can pick up minute electrical impulses, and this helps it detect preys like small shrimps who create electrical fields of nearly one millivolt per centimetre each time it moves its tail. The electric eel has 10 000 electric organs in its tail which can generate up to 550 volts – fatal even for a human.

Do you know that a duck can see all around itself (yes, even behind its head) without even turning its head? Did you know that a vulture can spot a carcass even while soaring 2000 metres in the air? The African guinea fowl can hear sounds in the infrasonic range (very low tones, indeed), and this is probably why they are inevitably accurate in foreseeing imminent rainfall, because thunderstorms always generate such sounds, and even though they are very far off, these birds can hear them. Rodents, on the other hand, tend to communicate with ultrasound. Rats generally use frequencies between 40 and 70 kHz, (humans can only hear up to 20kHz) and as cats are also sensitive to ultrasound, this is why they are so good at catching rodents.

Hence we see that the senses possessed by animals are really amazing. There are many not yet known or recorded down, but scientists are very sure that there are still many more surprises about animals which we have yet to discover.
